Q. 2 Read the given passage and answer the questions including Question No. (i) appended to it.

The Gender inequality is more conspicuously **manifested** when it comes to schooling, particularly education at higher level. Cultural boundaries and various gender roles lead to different approaches towards male and female education. In Pakistan, for example, a family may consider it useless to **impart** education to girls because they are supposed to get married eventually and to take on their major responsibilities of house making and babysitting. Majority of rural girls drop out of primary school. According to the ministry of women development report 2007, only 5% of women have attained the Bachelor degree and only 1.4% have achieved a Master degree. Likewise the World Economic Forum report 2020 states that while the majority of countries have **bridged** or nearly bridged the educational gender gap, Pakistan still stands at 20%. It further says about Pakistan, "Less than half of women are literate, compared with 71% of men".

Poor or irrelevant academics of women along with some other factors like marriage and cultural **stereotypes** lead to their joblessness and economic backwardness. Mostly across the globe, women can't find equal work opportunities and, so, remain economically dependent on men. They are **barred** from owning land and their control over household economic resources is also limited. Women, therefore are more likely to be living at or below the poverty line. As regards Pakistan, only one-quarter of women participate in the labour force i.e. working or looking to work compared with 85% of men. In this connection, WEF 2020 report says, "Only 5% of senior and leadership roles are held by women, twice the rate of 2016. It is estimated that only 18% of Pakistan's labour income goes to women, one of the lowest share among the countries studied". Pakistan has to improve upon this alarming situation as soon as possible because raising women's participation in the workforce and advancing their financial **empowerment** is the key to boosting economic growth and sustainable development in the country.

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## SECTION – B (Marks 40)

The Rasool (ﷺ) had given the banner of Islam to Massab Ibn Umayer ( ). He was martyred by the enemy and the banner of Islam fell on the ground. Nevertheless, Hazrat Ali ( ) **seized** the sacred banner and bore it aloft amidst the storm of battle. As Massab ( ) resembled the Rasool (ﷺ) in person, a shout was put up by the enemy that Hazrat Muhammad (ﷺ) God forbid, was martyred. The morale of the **polytheists** of Makkah was **beefed up** by this shout but it **demoralized** the Muslim Army.

The beloved Rasool (ﷺ) was fighting in the other part of the battlefield, was wounded, and his head and holy face were bleeding. A few Muslims mainly the Ansar were defending him. It was this little group and its battle cries that caught Ali's ( ) attention. He tore his way through enemy lines and came up to his comrade-in-arm. They stood surrounding the Rasool (ﷺ) led by Abu Dujana ( ). They were doing their best to shield him from the weapons of the enemy. He was thrilled to see his master alive.
